Provenance:	Millet School (Millet, Alta.).
Title:	Millet School fonds
Dates:	1923-1925, 1961-1990
Phys. Desc.:	9 cm of textual records and other material.
Bio-Admin History:	The first one-room school in Millet, Alberta was built in 1901, but it was destroyed by fire in 1902. The second school was built that same year and was enlarged twice. The third Millet School, with four classrooms, was completed in 1930, and has had several additions built on. In 1980, an intermediate-junior high school, Griffiths-Scott School, was built on its grounds. From 1901 to 1955, the school was governed by Millet School District No. 555. Subsequently, it was part of Wetaskiwin School Division No. 36 (1955-1958); the County of Wetaskiwin No. 10 (1958-1996); and the Wetaskiwin Regional School Division No. 11 (1996- ).
Custodial History:	Items in the fonds are from various sources including former students, school district records and special event committees. Administrative records pertaining to the school are filed as the Millet School District No. 555 fonds.
Scope/Content:	The fonds consists of students' creative works, and records of reunions of former students.
Title Source:	Title based on contents of fonds.
Language:	The material is in English.
Restrictions:	There are no restrictions on access.
