Bio/Admin History: Bert Loader was born in England on June 9<sup>th</sup> 1916, and lived their until April

1925 when they moved to Wetaskiwin as a part of the Soldier Settlement Board. Bert's father had served in the Imperial Army for 18 years, including 7 years in India. They joined in the settlement program to aid Bert's younger brothers'

health.

At age 10, Bert began a trap line to gain some income until he joined the RCAF on Oct. 1940. Initially he joined to be an aero engine mechanic but after a fire at the Gunnery Training Building, they were transferred to the firefighters. He was released from service on August 7<sup>th</sup> 1946.

After leaving the military, Bert worked with his brother-in-law for a year and a half then purchased the family farm. In 1953, he also took a job doing roadwork for the county for seven years. After leaving this work due to health concerns, he worked in a local shop and achieved his welding license. In 1963, he rain and won a position as a city councillor.

Bert retired from farming in 1975. He and his wife Lois (nee Marr) celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary on October 11, 1991. Unfortunately, his wife passed away three days later on October 14<sup>th</sup>, 1991. He remarried to Pearl Capson in August 1994. He passed away on August 6, 2010.
