Dates: 1916-1925

Bio / Admin History: Victor Clement Rowley (1887-1976) was the eldest son of Adelbert Bateman Rowley, an immigrant from the United States who operated a sawmill at Mulhurst, Alberta. Victor worked as a timekeeper and storekeeper for his father's business. In 1914 he married Grace Rogne (Rodney) of Millet. They had four children, Ruth, Tom, Del, and Ronald. In 1915 Victor moved to Millet to open a machine shop and act as an agent for the products of the sawmill. From 1921 to 1939 he operated a general store in Millet. He operated a general store at Rochfort Bridge, Alberta from 1939 to 1942, then lived in retirement in Vancouver, Victoria, and Edmonton.

Custodial History: The two binders were donated by the Royal Canadian Legion, Branch No. 229 (Millet), (Accession No. 86.14). The pamphlet was donated by Bill Marr of Millet (Accession No. 86.22).

Scope: Content: The fonds consists of two binders containing carbon copies of invoices issued by Victor C. Rowley for goods and services sold (1916-1917); and a pamphlet, Binder and Knotter Troubles, published by the University of Alberta College of Agriculture (1925), inscribed "Please return to V. C. Rowley, Millet".
